Background

To mark its 61st anniversary, throughout 2024 the FEDE will be holding a series of online and in-person events aiming to showcase our organisation's values: democracy, the rule of law, intercultural dialogue, gender equality, respect for human rights, sustainable development, and access to quality education for all.

One such event will be the FEDE's bilingual French-English webinar, which is to be held on **Tuesday 21 May 2024 from 2 PM to 5 PM** and is entitled ***Interculturality from the Standpoint of Ambassadors***.

The webinar will take place on **World Day for Cultural Diversity for Dialogue and Development**.

Since 2003, UNESCO has celebrated World Day for Cultural Diversity for Dialogue and Development every year on 21 May in order to celebrate both the rich diversity of cultures across the world and the crucial role played by intercultural dialogue in promoting peace and sustainable development.

- According to UNESCO, 89% of today's conflicts are located in countries where intercultural dialogue is limited or inexistent.
- In order to promote international cooperation and preserve peace, stability and development wherever possible, it is crucial to strengthen intercultural dialogue.

Overall goals

- Provide international ambassadors with an opportunity to present their approach to intercultural relations directly to learners and directors of educational institutions
- Build bridges between education actors and high-level diplomats
- Broaden participants' vision of interculturality and inspire change

More specifically, the webinar aims, in particular, **to understand why it is enriching to learn from other cultures, and in what ways interculturality can promote inclusion, personal flourishing and career success**.

The event aims to attract several hundred participants: ambassadors, FEDE students, heads of FEDE educational institutions, and representatives of civil-society organisations.

Main issues

Ambassadors presenting their views on the subject might wish to address topics such as:

- How can we avoid stereotypes in our approach to cultures?
- Why does cultural diversity matter?
- How can we promote and develop interculturality?
- What role can interculturality play in strengthening citizenship skills?
- In what ways is interculturality important at a societal level?
- Are multilingualism and intercultural skills important for career success?
- What are the main benefits of intercultural management?
- In what ways can the use of information and communication technology (ITC) facilitate intercultural dialogue, respect and mutual understanding?
- Does interculturality play a role in ensuring the inclusion of minorities?
